SHORT BIOGRAPHY AND SUMMARY OF ACCOMPLISHMENTS

In a city under siege, where echoes of conflict still reverberating years later, a group of extraordinary women in the person of Sr. PPO/OIC Norolain A. Racman, PPO I Ainisah G. Bantuas, ADA IV Babaino B. Alawi and JOP Narima Manalocom, stood firm. They are the officers; the women of Grit and Grace of the **Marawi City Parole and Probation Office**.

The aftermath of the Marawi siege brought new challenges: the arduous task of reconnecting with and supporting probationers and parolees scattered by the conflict. And even now, seven years on, the specter of armed conflict continues to loom, triggering anxiety and fear within the community, the Probation and Parole Officers of the Marawi City PPO thrives. Yet, they have not only navigated their own anxieties but have also extended a lifeline of psychosocial support to the wider community. Their duty also demands regular venture into the field, conducting background investigations and home visitations in areas often scarred by “rido” (inter-family conflicts) – placing them in harm’s way. Despite these challenges, they have consistently displayed exceptional courage in the line of duty, becoming vital bridges and reconnecting their clients with essential resources through strategic partnerships with various stakeholders.
